Dr. Alcaide is the Kenneth and JoAnn G. Wellner Professor of Immunology, the Director of the Immunology Graduate program and the Assistant Dean for Faculty Development at Tufts University School of Medicine, Boston, MA. She received her PhD, *cum laude*, in Molecular Biology and Immunology from Universidad Autonoma of Madrid, Spain. Dr. Alcaide trained in vascular biology at the Department of Pathology, Brigham and Women's hospital as a Fulbright postdoctoral scholar, and was an Instructor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School prior to joining Tufts University in 2012.

Dr. Alcaide's research focuses on understanding the role of T lymphocytes in cardiac inflammation and the impact of the adaptive immune response in the progression of heart failure. Dr. Alcaide's impactful work in the growing field of cardio-immunology has been published in prestigious journals such as Circulation, the Journal of Experimental Medicine, The Journal of Clinical Investigation and Nature Cardiovascular Research and resulted in continuously funded grants from the NIH and private foundations. Dr. Alcaide has received several awards, including the Cotran Early Career Investigator and the Outstanding Investigator awards by the American Society of Investigative Pathology (ASIP), the ISHR Mid Career Research and Scholarship Award and the FASEB Outstanding Mid Career Investigator Award. Dr. Alcaide serves as Associate Editor of the Journal of Molecular and Cellular Cardiology and the Journal of Leukocyte Biology and is in the Editorial boards of the Journal of Clinical Investigation insight, Circulation Research, Circulation: Heart Failure and the FASEB Journal.
